- **European Roulette:** The house edge is approximately 2.7%, thanks to the single zero. This means for every 100 units

wagered, the casino expects to keep 2.7 units on average.

- **American Roulette:** The house edge rises to about 5.26% due to the additional double zero. This nearly doubles the casino's advantage compared to European roulette.

For Vietnamese players aiming to maximize their chances, this difference is significant. European roulette offers almost double the likelihood of winning compared to American roulette on average bets.

Betting Options and Payouts

Both versions of roulette offer similar betting options, including:

- **Inside bets:** betting on specific numbers or small groups of numbers (higher risk, higher payout).
- **Outside bets:** betting on broader categories like red/black, odd/even, or groups of numbers (lower risk, lower payout).

Payouts for the same bets are generally consistent across both versions. For example, a straight-up bet on a single number pays 35 to 1. The primary difference in expected returns comes from the house edge explained above.

En Prison and La Partage Rules — A Plus for European Roulette

One notable advantage that European roulette sometimes offers (though not always in every casino) is the presence of special rules like **En Prison** or **La Partage**, which can reduce the house edge even further on even-money bets.

- **La Partage:** If the ball lands on zero, players lose only half their even-money bet instead of all of it.
- **En Prison:** If the ball lands on zero, the bet is “imprisoned” and carried over to the next spin. If the next spin results in a win, the player recovers the bet; if not, the bet is lost.

These rules can reduce the house edge on even-money bets to as low as 1.35%, making European roulette even more attractive to players who want better odds.

American roulette does not offer these rules, which means the house edge remains higher throughout.

Which Should Vietnamese Players Choose?

Given these differences, European roulette clearly stands out as the better option for players seeking a lower house edge and improved chances to win. Vietnamese bettors who enjoy strategic play and want to minimize losses will find European roulette more appealing, especially when the casino offers the En Prison or La Partage rules.

American roulette, on the other hand, tends to appeal more to players who enjoy a faster pace and the excitement of an extra twist with the double zero, even if the odds are less favorable. Some players are drawn to American roulette for its slightly different betting layout and feel, but it's generally less recommended from a purely statistical perspective.
